New Jersey's CDBG-DR Action Plan detailed the substantial damage that Superstorm Sandy caused to the State's housing sector. While damage from Superstorm Sandy occurred throughout the state, housing damage was particularly concentrated in communities bordering or near the Atlantic Ocean or the Hudson River. Many of these communities were flooded by Sandy's storm surge. FEMA Individual Assistance data as of March 12, 2013 reflected that the greatest concentrations of housing damage were located in the following counties: Atlantic (12%), Bergen (5%), Cape May (4%), Essex (2%), Hudson (6%), Middlesex (5%), Monmouth (16%), Ocean (35%) and Union (6%).

Superstorm Sandy significantly affected both homeowner and rental properties. Based on FEMA Individual Assistance data effective March 12, 2013, approximately 40,500 owners' primary residences and over 15,600 rental units sustained "severe" or "major" damage according to classifications made by HUD. Moreover, many residences were "substantially damaged," meaning that damages exceed 50% of the homes pre-disaster value. In total, the FEMA data from March 12, 2013 indicated that 59,971 owner-occupied homes and 21,900 rental units sustained ome level of physical damage from the storm. As referenced in the State's Action Plan, these figures likely underestimate the breadth of Superstorm Sandy's impact on the housing sector.

The storm's impact on low- to moderate-income (LMI) households in New Jersey was particularly pronounced. FEMA Individual Assistance data as of March 12, 2013 demonstrated that of applicants who reported major or severe damage to their homes, 49% were LMI households. Moreover, 74% of renters that reported damage to their homes to FEMA were LMI households. While LMI households throughout the State were affected by the storm, the most impacted LMI households generally were within the counties with the greatest concentrations of damage, identified above.

Economic Development:

Superstorm Sandy devastated many businesses in New Jersey, causing substantial commercial property damage and short-term and long-term business operations losses. In addition to the physical damage Sandy caused to businesses themselves, widespread power outages resulted in inventory losses and working capital losses. Damage to public infrastructure such as roads, rail and bridges as well as compromised water utility systems and gas unavailability compounded those damages. This explains why data compiled soon after the storm suggested that businesses within 113 of New Jersey's 565 municipalities incurred a combined \$382,000,000 in commercial property losses and another \$63,900,000 in business interruption losses. While Superstorm Sandy caused damage across all state industries, some industries -- particularly the tourism industry -- were substantially affected.

The storm also is estimated to have affected over 1,000,000 employees in New Jersey's workforce. Data compiled in the months after the storm indicates that approximately 138,000 workers filed unemployment claims in November 2012, the first full month after Superstorm Sandy. By comparison, unemployment claims in November 2011 totaled 54,444 claims.

Infrastructure:

Superstorm Sandy's storm surge and associated flooding extensively impacted New Jersey's infrastructure. Critical facilities and assets throughout the State were directly damaged. Sandy left nearly seventy percent of ratepayers statewide without electricity. Water and wastewater treatment facilities were unable to sustain operations. Roadways experienced significant damage from extensive flooding and sustained winds resulted in debris that made critical evacuation routes impassable. Rail and other public transit systems, which suspended operations in anticipation of the storm, were substantially damaged.

Recovery Needs:

Housing:

New Jersey estimated in its Action Plan an unmet need in the housing sector totaling \$2,504,993,992. The State calculated that figure by adding estimated repair and replacement costs and estimated costs for required elevations to reach a total need figure. The State then subtracted funding provided from other sources such as private insurance, FEMA, and SBA, to reach the unmet need. As stated in the Action Plan, this figure likely understates the extent of New Jersey's housing needs.

Economic: New Jersey estimated in its Action Plan an unmet need in the economic sector of \$1,727,813,413. The State calculated that figure by adding estimated commercial losses and business interruption losses to arrive at a total need figure. The State then subtracted funding provided from other sources,

such as commercial insurance and SBA. As stated in the Action Plan, this figure does not account for long-term losses or systemic impacts to the State's key economic base, notably the tourism and coastal real estate market. As a result, this figure likely understates the extent of New Jersey's needs in the economic sector

Infrastructure: New Jersey estimated in its Action Plan an unmet need in the infrastructure sector of \$25,432,594,266. The State calculated that figure by adding estimated damage costs to needed hazard mitigation measures to arrive at a total need figure. The State then subtracted funding provided from other sources, such as FEMA Public Assistance. As stated in the Action Plan, these figures are preliminary and subject to change. Affirmatively Further Fair Housing:

The State is committed to affirmatively further fair housing through its housing programs, following all applicable federal and state statutes and regulations, and enforcing fair housing laws. The State will ensure that housing assistance relating to Superstorm Sandy recovery is prioritized and allocated solely based on disaster-related need, without regard to raise or ethnicity. Information relating to demographics of impacted communities will be utilized to ensure that assistance is accessible and reaches New derseyans in need. In support, the State, among other things, has stood up household assistance centers in each of the nine most impacted counties to assist residence and communities with recovery programs and the application process.

Overall Progress Narrative:

Overall Progress Narrative Summary for 4th Quarter 2013 QPR: 1st allocation

New Jersey is rapidly moving forward with disbursement of Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds to support the recovery of Sandy-impacted residents, businesses and communities. Within just eight months of receiving HUD approval of the State's Action Plan, the State has implemented 17 CDBG-DR funded recovery programs, and it has awarded over half of the \$1.82 billion New Jersey was allocated by HUD as part of the first tranche of CDBG-DR Sandy recovery funding.

As required by HUD, the State has prepared this Quarterly Performance Report addressing first tranche CDBG-DR funding obligations and disbursements through the fourth quarter of 2013 (October – December). The report shows that, through December 31, 2013, New Jersey has obligated nearly \$1 billion and disbursed over \$314 million in first tranche CDBG-DR funds. The report highlights the rapid and considerable progress New Jersey has made in implementing and executing CDBG-DR funded recovery programs, and the State expects that this momentum will continue into the first quarter of 2014.

HOUSING ACTIVITIES:

Using first tranche CDBG-DR funds, the State's CDBG-DR funded housing programs have focused on repairing or replacing damaged housing units and assisting homeowners and renters with budget strains caused by unanticipated storm-related expenses.

For homeowners, the Homeowner Resettlement Program is a \$180 million program that encourages Sandy-impacted homeowners to remain in the nine most impacted counties, as determined by HUD, by providing \$10,000 grants to eligible households as an incentive to remain in their existing home or in their impacted county. The funds can be used to address various types of storm-related expenses. As of December 31, 2013, a total of 16,615 Homeowner Resettlement Program grants had been processed for payment, resulting in \$166,150,000 distributed directly to impacted households. Compared to the previous quarter in which 11,772 program applications were processed, an additional 4,843 Resettlement grants were processed.

During this quarter, the State also requested that HUD approve the State's proposal to add \$35 million in existing CDBG-DR funding to the Homeowner Resettlement Program. This would allow the State to provide each of the more than 2,100 Sandy-impacted families on the program's waitlist with a \$10,000 grant. HUD approved New Jersey's request on January 8, 2014, and the State is now processing these grants. As a result of HUD's approval, the State will be able to fully fund every eligible Sandy-impacted homeowner who applied to the program. The State expects that all funding through the Homeowner Resettlement Program will have been disbursed by the close of first quarter of 2014.

The Reconstruction, Rehabilitation, Elevation and Mitigation (RREM) Program, the State's largest CDBG-DR program, has made significant progress this quarter. The program provides grants up to \$150,000 to eligible homeowners to reconstruct, repair, elevate or undertake mitigation measures for their storm-damaged homes. As of December 31, 2013, the State had processed all applications and sent preliminary funding approval letters to more than 4,100 homeowners. As homeowners move through thecess and receive all required environmental clearances, they are scheduled for grant award signings. By the end of the quarter the State completed grant award signings with nearly 970 RREM applicants, obligating more than \$96 million in grant assistance, including sending out checks to homeowners for more than \$15 million in reimbursements for rebuilding work already completed.

Additionally, numerous RREM grant award signing appointments are scheduled every day. Indeed, between the end of the fourth quarter of 2013 and January 31,

2014, the number of applicants who had signed grant agreements had increased to over 1,200, with an estimated \$135 million in grant assistance directly awarded, inclusive of approximately \$25 million in reimbursements. Upon signing a grant award, an applicant moves into the construction scope of work and construction phase of the RREM process, both with homeowners using a program-selected contractor and an owner-selected contractor.

At the end of the fourth quarter of 2013, the RREM Program waitlist exceeded 8,000 preliminarily eligible but unfunded applicants. The State requested that HUD approve a request to add \$110 million in existing CDBG-DR funding to the RREM Program to enable approximately 1,000 Sandy-impacted families currently on the waitlist to receive a RREM grant. HUD approved New Jersey's request on January 8, 2014, and the State has sent letters to the 1,000 homeowners who are moving off the RREM waitlist to notify them that they've been preliminarily approved for a RREM grant and advising them of next steps. The approximately 7,000 homeowners who remain on the RREM waitlist are being advised of where they are on the waitlist.

In addition to the Homeowner Resettlement and RREM Programs, New Jersey is taking critical steps to spur the development of affordable rental housing in order to confront Sandy's impact on rental housing stock through a multi-prong strategy of programs. The State has committed \$379 million in first tranche CDBG-DR funds for programs specifically designed to benefit low-to-moderate income renters. These funds will increase the stock of affordable rental housing in Sandy-impacted counties, repair affordable rental units left uninhabitable by the storm, and provide housing options for residents with special needs. It is anticipated that over the course of 2 years, the State will provide assistance to support approximately 7,000 units of affordable rental housing.

The Fund for Restoration of Multi-Family Housing (FRM) is the State's largest rental recovery program, focusing on the repair or creation of quality affordable rental housing stock. The State allocated \$179.52 million of first tranche CDBG-DR funds to FRM, of which \$20 million was reserved specifically for repairs to public housing authorities and other federally-funded housing. Through the end of the fourth quarter of 2013, nearly \$157 million in FRM funds have been committed across 36 projects, most of which also leverage low income housing tax credits. The State currently projects that this investment will create nearly 2,500 affordable housing authority projects received a commitment of funds, in Jersey City and Hudson County.ns; These two projects will provide the construction and permanent financing needed for the rehabilitation of 319 affordable rental housing units for families and 48 affordable rental housing units for seniors. More than 20 projects are expected to reach official award and financial closing in the next quarter.

The Neighborhood Enhancement Program (NEP) funds the rehabilitation or re-use of abandoned, foreclosed or vacant housing units and lots to both address the risk of blight and increase affordable housing. During the fourth quarter of 2013, eighteen zero-interest loans were awarded totaling \$12 million that will help finance 85 units of affordable housing while assisting with the stabilization of Sandy-impacted neighborhoods threatened by blight. The first round of awards was made on October 24, 2013. The second round of NEP awards brings to 33 the total number of loans awarded, cumulatively totaling \$25.6 million in funding that will help finance 170 units of affordable housing.

The Landlord Rental Repair Program supports the rehabilitation of damaged rental properties with 25 units or less, and making them available at affordable rates and to low-to moderate-income tenants. The program's application period concluded on November 15, 2013. The State received 1,383 completed applications affecting 2,400 damaged housing units. Applicants are actively moving through the program process with more than 1,100 appointment packets sent to applicants and nearly 850 intake appointments completed. As of December 31, 2013, 526 applications have been submitted for initial site inspections, amounting to 745 rental units. Additionally, four grant awards have been signed, obligating nearly \$200,000. The program will ramp up during next quarter as applications continue to be processed, site inspections are completed and grants signed.

The Landlord Incentive Program provides grant incentives to landlords to make the cost of rental units more affordable, thereby addressing the need for more affordable housing and assisting renters, and particularly low- and moderate-income renter households, facing budget challenges resulting from the storm. Through the fourth quarter of 2013, the State has awarded contracts totaling approximately \$5 million in funding to more than 40 rental properties to help finance 250 units of affordable rental housing.

The Predevelopment Loan Fund for Affordable Rental Housing this quarter awarded \$2.65 million in low-interest loans to the non-profit developers to support the planning of six projects that are expected to supply a total of 603 units of affordable housing. That brings to 1,036 the total number of affordable housing units being supported for planning and development to be created. The program awarded \$3 million in September 2013 to help support the design and develop of 433 housing units. These funds are assisting non-profit developers at the early stages of development to allow them to complete site planning as well as work to finalize construction and permanent financing.

The Sandy Special Needs Housing Fund has committed nearly \$16 million to 14 projects that will provide permanent supportive rental housing units for special needs populations, including individuals with mental, physical, or developmental disabilities. Closings are anticipated in the next quarter with most of the projects expected to start constucio i February and March of this year.

The Sandy Homebuyer Assistance Program closed on 40 interest-free, forgivable mortgages as of December 31, 2013 to help low- and moderate-income families buy homes in Sandy-impacted communities. Of these, 18 mortgage loans have been drawn down, including 16 in this quarter. The remainder of the closed mortgages will be drawn down in the first guarter of 2014.

ECONOMIC RECOVERY AND REVITALIZATION ACTIVITIES:

The State has implemented various CDBG-DR funded economic recovery and revitalization programs to augment other recovery funding streams available to impacted businesses with access to capital needs as well as needs to address physical damage and short- and long-term business operations losses caused by the storm.

The Stronger NJ Business Grant Program, a \$100 million program, provides grants of up to \$50,000 to affected businesses for working capital or construction needs. The application period for the program opened on May 1, 2013 and closed on December 31, 2013. More than 3,300 applications were opened by prospective applicants requesting in excess of \$167 million in assistance. Through the end of the fourth quarter of 2013, nearly \$10 million in funding had been awarded and more than \$6 million had been disbursed. The State continues to process applications that have been submitted and expects significant additional funding through this program to be obligated and disbursed during the first quarter of 2014.

Additionally, the Stronger NJ Business Loan Program, funded with \$100 million in first tranche CDBG-DR funds, provides loans up to \$5 million to allow businesses to rebuild and expand, which also creates jobs for recovering New Jersey households. The State has received more than 400 applications for this program, requesting in excess of \$96 million. Through the end of the fourth quarter of 2014, approximately \$10 million in assistance has been obligated through this program, and the State's review of program applications remains ongoing.

In addition to the two programs that directly assist businesses, the State has implemented a Neighborhood and Community Revitalization Program (NCR) funded with \$75 million of first tranche CDBG-DR funds that incorporates three separate initiatives. The Streetscape Revitalization Grant Program, to which the State has allocated \$10 million of NCR funds, offers grants to municipalities to assist in the rebuilding and to support the recovery of economic activity in commercial corridors in the most impacted towns and clites throughout the State. The application period for this program closed on December 31, 2013 and requests for funding far exceed available funding. The State is in the process of reviewing applications. Additionally, the State set aside \$2.5 million of NCR funds for Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFIs) to support micro-lending for businesses. That initiative is fully subscribed. The remainder of NCR funding is directed to support large economic revitalization projects. As with the Streetscape Revitalization Grant Program, demand for funding has far exceed available resources. On the whole, through the fourth quarter of 2013, more than \$230 million in requests here submitted for NCR initiatives. To date, \$7.5 million of NCR funds, \$7.5 million of NCR funds have been obligated, and the Stae epecs tat figure to increase in the first quarter of 2014.

Finally, the State committed \$25 million of first tranche CDBG-DR funds to support a 2013 tourism marketing campaign to combat the misperception that Superstorm Sandy destroyed all New Jersey shore tourism assets. Because the majority of the tourism marketing campaign was held between Memorial Day and Labor Day, tourism marketing campaign funding activity in the fourth quarter of 2013 was minimal.

OTHER CDBG-DR PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

In addition to supporting recovery in the housing and economic development and revitalization sectors, the State allocated first tranche CDBG-DR funds to program to support an array of other critical recovery initiatives.

The State also has committed first tranche CDBG-DR funds to address non-federal cost share obligations, community planning needs, and supportive services initiatives to augment some of the initiatives being funded with federal Social Services Block Grant monies. The Post Sandy Planning Assistance Grant Program is designed to help Sandy-impacted local governments plan their rebuilding efforts to promote resilience and encourage economic growth. This quarter the State executed subrecipient agreements with 19 communities and obligated more than \$507,000 in funds. More than \$4.7 million in planning grant requests have been received, representing 46 communities, to prepare a long range strategic plan that identifies areas of vulnerabilities, the conditions created or exacerbated by the storm and approaches to resilient rebuilding. Included in that number are towns seeking money for more specific purposes such as the development of environmental design standards. To date, 35 local governments have been awarded nearly \$1 million in initial funding to create a long range strategic plan. Those communities will then request follow-on funds for addressing aspects of their long range plan when completed.

Finally, the State established a Zoning and Code Enforcement Program to assist communities struggling to respond to an influx of zoning and code enforcementrelated requests arising from the storm. The Code Enforcement Program has helped ensure that homes are built safer and up to code by conducting nearly 7,200 building code inspections in the fourth quarter of 2013 in towns such as Berkeley, Brick, Keansburg, Lavallette, Little Egg Harbor, Manasquan, Mantoloking, Seaside Heights, Seaside Park, Toms River and Union Beach. These inspections are in addition to the more than 15,500 that were conducted as of September 30, 2013.

The State's efforts to use CDBG-DR funds to address unmet needs across various recovery sectors are wholly consistent with the State's ongoing holistic approach to Sandy recovery. The State also continues to leverage CDBG-DR funds and other funding streams to maximize the impact of available recovery resources for recovering New Jerseyans. By these efforts and as shown in this report, the State's has made substantial and measurable progress in its recovery efforts through the course of 2013, and expects that progress to continue over the course of 2014.

Activity Description:

Many Sandy-impacted homeowner had significant property damage to their residences and have suffered diminished property values. Moreover, some homeowners whose residences were substantially damaged by the storm will be required to elevate their residences. Additionally, with the passage of the Biggert-Waters Flood Insurance Act, flood insurance premiums for many are likely to rise, particularly for residences not above FEMA's base flood elevation. All of these costs threaten to force homeowners, and particularly LMI households, to leave their communities. The Homeowner Resettlement program is targeted to alleviate some of the pressures facing homeowners impacted by Superstorm Sandy.

The State of New Jersey allocated \$180 million in CDBG-DR funds to encourage homeowners in the 9 most impacted counties to remain in the county where their home was damaged. In the 4th quarter 2013, the State requested approval from HUD to shift \$35 million into this program. This approval will be reflected in the first quarter of 2013. The Resettlement Program allows homeowners who meet eligibility requirements to receive an incentive grant of \$10,000. Eligibility is based on the following criteria: the damaged property being located in one of the 9 most impacted categories, timely FEMA registration, proof of ownership and primary residence at the time of the storm, proof of primary residence having \$8,000 of damage, or having sustained 1ft of water on the 1st floor of the residence. The applicant must be willing to remain in the county for three years. Applicants were able to complete an application online, through a phone interview, or in person at a regional recovery housing center. The initial application period ran from May 24, 2013 through June 30, 2013 (Group 1). A second application period ran from July 1, 2013 to August 1, 2013 (Group 2). For Group 1, 60% of funds were initially reserved for eligible LMI applicants. For Group 2, applicants were processed on a 1st received, 1st processed basis. As of January 20th 2014, 16,660 resettlement grants have been processed for payment, for a total of \$166,600,000.00. Compared to the previous quarter in

Activity Description:

Many Sandy-impacted homeowner had significant property damage to their residences and have suffered diminished property values. Moreover, some homeowners whose residences were substantially damaged by the storm will be required to elevate their residences. Additionally, with the passage of the Biggert-Waters Flood Insurance Act, flood insurance premiums for many are likely to rise, particularly for residences not above FEMA's base flood elevation. All of these costs threaten to force homeowners, and particularly LMI households, to leave their communities. The Homeowner Resettlement program is targeted to alleviate some of the pressures facing homeowners impacted by Superstorm Sandy.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The State of New Jersey allocated \$180 million in CDBG-DR funds to encourage homeowners in the 9 most impacted counties to remain in the county where their home was damaged. In the 4th quarter 2013, the State requested approval from HUD to shift \$35 million into this program. This approval will be reflected in the first quarter of 2013. The Resettlement Program allows homeowners who meet eligibility requirements to receive an incentive grant of \$10,000. Eligibility is based on the following criteria: the damaged property being located in one of the 9 most impacted categories, timely FEMA registration, proof of primary residence having \$8,000 of damage, or having sustained 1ft of water on the 1st floor of the residence. The applicant must be willing to remain in the county for three years. Applicants were able to complete an application online, through a phone interview, or in person at a regional recovery housing center. The initial application period ran from May 24, 2013 through June 30, 2013 (Group 1). A second application period ran from July 1, 2013 to August 1, 2013 to Group 2). For Group 1, 60% of funds were initially reserved for eligible LMI applicants. For Group 2, applicants were processed on a 1st received, 1st processed basis.

As of January 20th 2014, 16,660 resettlement grants have been processed for payment, for a total of \$166,600,000.00. Compared to the previous quarter in which 11,772 resettlement applications were processed, an additional 4,888 resettlement grants were processed. It is anticipated that all eligible applicants who met the application deadline, many of whom were previously waitlisted, will now be funded. Due to the composition of the actual applications received, funds were shifted between the urgent need budget and the low to moderate income budget.
